Dear Friends,

By mere chance, I happened to come across a news story in mid-August which was buried on the BBC's website, and which I assume most American news outlets never even covered. It was a story about one of the great problems facing the developing and under-developed world today – the ongoing persecution of Christians.



Christians across the globe continue to face hostility, oppression, prejudice, and violence, in many ways worse than at any other time in modern history. And yet Christians living in the comfort of places like the United States largely ignore the suffering of our brothers and sisters in the faith.

This particular case involved mob violence on August 16th in eastern Pakistan. A local Christian had been accused of tearing pages from the Qur'an, writing on them, and tossing them to the ground. Muslim nations have strict blasphemy laws which are easy tools for hearsay and false accusations. Nevertheless, Christian-hating crowds often find them to be convenient excuses for violence against the faithful.

In this case, one Christian church was entirely burned down and several others were damaged. One Christian home was destroyed and several more homes damaged as well. Christians fled to escape death from the mob. In order to placate the crowds, two Christians were arrested and charged with breaking the blasphemy laws.

Christians make up less than 2% of Pakistan's population. The organization Open Doors ranks the nation as the 7th worst worldwide for persecution of Christians. Their website explains:

In Pakistan, Christians are considered second-class citizens and are discriminated against in every aspect of public and private life.... Christian women and girls are particularly vulnerable in Pakistan. Reports indicate there is a silent epidemic of kidnappings, forced marriages and forced conversion of Christian girls and women. Christian women and girls are constantly at risk of sexual assault, abduction and forced conversion. .... Christian men are particularly vulnerable to being falsely accused under Pakistan's blasphemy laws. They are often compelled to take lower-state jobs referred to as 'chura,' a derogatory word meaning 'filthy'.

Unfortunately, the church in America is largely silent – and ignorant – about the suffering of minority Christian populations in places like Pakistan. Let's help change that trend. Look for these stories, read about persecution, and pray for Christians as they suffer for their faith. They deserve no less.
