

Dear Friends,

Appearing in nearly 1,100 known hymnals, "It Came Upon a Midnight Clear" is a true staple of the Christmas season. It has also been lauded as one of the first and truest American-written hymns in the Christmas carol form. It might surprise us to find that this song has also been a source of past controversy and holds deeply political overtones. As a lyrical, soothing piece of music, we can easily overlook its fraught past.

"It Came Upon a Midnight Clear" was written by a minister named Edmund H. Sears (1810-1876). Sears was no ordinary minister, however. A liberal, Unitarian, Massachusetts pastor educated at Harvard Divinity School, Sears was an avid abolitionist and advocate of women's rights. He was also part of a denomination which does not and did not recognize the concept of the Trinity. As the nation barreled into the Western prairies and the Industrial Revolution built up new cities, Sears represented a cultured, socially progressive New England sometimes out of tune with the bustling nation it had spawned.



After a period of poor health, Sears penned "It Came Upon a Midnight Clear" in 1849 as his own very personal response to the times of division and struggle the United States was going through, during the tense era between the Mexican War and the Civil War. The hymn concentrates on the beauty of celestial peace falling upon the earth, a peace Sears longed to see in America.

Some argued against the inclusion of a Christmas carol written by a Unitarian. Despite his formal affiliation, however, Sears did believe in Christ's divinity and even wrote an influential book on the Gospel of John and its treatment of Christ. Nevertheless, as a politically-charged hymn by a pastor from a theologically liberal tradition, "It Came Upon a Midnight Clear" did not gain universal acceptance easily in its own day.

"Above its sad and lonely plains," filled with "Babel sounds" the angels bring good news and the gift of peace. Many years, filled with many conflicts, have come and gone through these intervening decades, but the earth, and indeed our nation, continues to need to hear "the blessed angels sing."


