Dear Friends,

Opponents of scripture will often point to a lack of archaeological evidence for various important events in the Bible, and use this lack of evidence as reason for not believing in the Word of God. Nevertheless, despite the passage of centuries and even millennia, tremendous amounts of archaeological evidence has been found in support of the Bible, and new findings are uncovered every year.



One such finding occurred earlier this year in Megiddo, the ancient city in northern Israel which is better known to us by its Greek name, Armageddon. To set the stage, 2 Kings 23 tells us: "While Josiah was king, Pharaoh Necho king of Egypt went up to the Euphrates River to help the king of Assyria. King Josiah marched out to meet him in battle, but Necho faced him and killed him at Megiddo. Josiah's servants brought his body in a chariot from Megiddo to Jerusalem and buried him in his own tomb."

In other words, Egyptian forces, under Pharoah Necho, while fighting the Assyrians, also defeated Josiah in battle at Megiddo. 2 Chronicles 35 provides more details, saying that Josiah was mortally wounded by an arrow. He was then carried back to Jerusalem, where he died.

The town of Megiddo has been extensively excavated, but in recent years archaeologists have dug in a new portion of the site which they dubbed Area X. To their surprise, pottery fragments were recently found in the remains of a building in Area X which are of Egyptian origin. The fragments are also of the kind of humble pottery which would have been brought along by soldiers, not something traded from one civilization to another. Moreover, they date back to the exact same period when Megiddo was overthrown and King Josiah was killed.

What the pottery shards and other artifacts demonstrate is that this biblical battle must have occurred, as it is the best explanation for such a sudden change in populace and culture. Modern archaeology is rife with examples of findings which support or downright prove ancient facts found in the Old and New Testaments. The Bible is a book of truth, and that includes historical truth, as science continues to discover.


Unfinished Business: The banner will be prepared soon. At the February meeting Hebrews 10:22 was selected as the verse for the banner.
